Father Jim DiVasto was ordained to the sacred priesthood on May 20, 2023 by Bishop Frank Caggiano. Bishop Caggiano immediately appointed Father Jim parochial vicar for Our Lady of Fatima Church in Wilton. He subsequently transferred his KofC membership to our parish Council 12698 and became our Chaplain. Father DiVasto was born in Stamford, Connecticut. He graduated from Saint Anselm College, Manchester, New Hampshire. During the latter half of his 37-year career with the Knights of Columbus Supreme office, he served as a complaint administrator regarding the KofC insurance program and its agents. Upon early retirement in May 2018, he found himself overwhelmed by thoughts and feelings that God might be calling him again to serve Him in the priesthood as once he experienced upon college graduation. After five years of priestly formation as a seminarian for the Diocese of Bridgeport, he has come to understand that God has been calling and forming him to be a loving servant all along through every person, place, and event of his life. "I'm just very, very grateful, humbled and thrilled," he said. "I'm here today in no small way because of all the prayerful support of my family, friends, brother seminarians, religious sisters, priests, deacons, and everyone at Pope Saint John XXIII National Seminary, and especially Bishop Caggiano. What a gift! Thanks be to God!"

Dear Brothers and families, the grace and peace of our crucified and risen Lord Jesus Christ be with you all this Easter season! During these coming seven weeks to Pentecost, the Sunday gospels will be entirely from the Gospel of Saint John with only one exception. On the Third Sunday of Easter, we will hear the Gospel of Luke in which the two disciples returned from Emmaus and telling the other disciples of what happened are suddenly interrupted by the arrival of the Risen Lord Jesus.

British poet, artist, and spiritual author, Caryll Houselander (+1954) offers you and me a profound, deeper meaning of the disciples' journey to Emmaus that no doubt is a fruit of the work of the Holy Spirit in her.

"After his Resurrection, Christ showed himself to his friends five times, which are recorded. But what was he doing, where was he during the rest of the forty days? We may guess that he visited many unknown people; he may have gone to the slums of Jerusalem, the prisons, the caves of lepers. He may have been suddenly among children, playing with them, not recognized for who he was, but not questioned either. But this is guesswork. Saint John simply tells us that, 'there are many other miracles Jesus did in the presence of his disciples, which are not written down in this book.'

Some of the Fathers of the Church say that when Christ broke the bread at Emmaus, he gave his Body to the two disciples in Communion; in our life now that miracle is worked day after day with just the same secrecy . . . Yet while we watch we see nothing. There is the wafer of unleavened bread; it is changed to the Body of Christ who is God; it looks, feels, tastes, the same as before. The Blessed Sacrament is so much part of our ordinary life that we hardly ever realize that we are involved in a deed greater than any miracle every day . . .

There is another record of those forty days which brings us the key of this secrecy: 'He had shown them by many proofs that he was still alive, after his Passion; throughout the course of forty days he had been appearing to them and telling them about the Kingdom of God (Acts 1:3)'

The lock into which this key fits is our own lives today. He wanted to prove then, as he wants to prove in us now, that it was He who was still alive, with the same character, the same way of doing things. Those of His miracles that need not be made public to give glory to his Father he works in secret, with such courtesy . . . Such are the daily unobserved, unguessed miracles of grace, contrition, conversion, hope, forgiveness, love, taking place secretly in human souls."

May Blessed Father Michael McGivney intercede for you and me this Easter season and help us to allow the crucified and risen Lord to accomplish his secret works in us now and always.

The Christmas Creche Build


Now an annual event, the Knights worked together as a team to build Our Lady of Fatima's Creche in Wilton Town Center.


The Knights of Columbus Council 12698 have re-established their website. The new web site can be found at
