

This year, the Knights arranged for 2 Rosaries to be said on behalf of good causes. The first was said on **October 7<sup>th</sup>** on the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary for Council 12698 and the Knights. **On Saturday, October 26th 2024**, more than 900 brand new coats and hand-knit winter hats were distributed to clients of Family & Children's Agency (FCA) by the greater Norwalk area Knights of Columbus Councils as part of the Order's Coats for Kids Initiative. Since the initiative launched in 2009, more than 1 million coats have been distributed in 49 states and all 10 Canadian provinces to keep kids warm through the winter.

The Wilton Knights of Columbus made a significant contribution this year – collections were held over 2 weekends and the parishioners contributed over \$2000 towards the initiative. Thanks to everyone who helped make this a huge success!
